Heritage Tourism Alliance of Montgomery County Announces FY 2011 Mini-Grant Awards – Round 2!

Germantown, Maryland: The Heritage Tourism Alliance of Montgomery County is a non-profit organization created to bring the county's rich history to the attention of its residents and visitors. The Mini-Grant Program recognizes county groups and their programs that contribute to interpreting, promoting, preserving, researching and/or supporting our historical legacy.

For the first time, a second Mini-Grant round was opened specifically for activities in support of Heritage Days Weekend – June 25 & 26, 2011. This annual Heritage Montgomery celebration features over 40 heritage sites open free-of-charge all around Montgomery County with fun family activities – music, games, children's activities, food, and more!

Heritage Montgomery is pleased to announce three new grants totaling \$3,500 to the following recipients:

Sandy Spring Slave Museum, Sandy Spring – \$1000 for musical performances by the Washington Revels at the site where visitors can see the cross-section of a slave clipper ship and log cabin as well as an extensive arts pavilion.

Clarksburg Historical Society, Clarksburg – \$1000 for traffic control and trolley car services at the new Dowden's Ordinary Park, the site of a major stop on the Great Road from Georgetown to Frederick where generals, presidents and other notables stopped during the War of 1812 and the Civil War.

Menare Foundation, Germantown – \$500 for performances by the 80-voice Mosaic Harmony gospel singers at the Button Farm Living History Center where 1850s plantation life is depicted.

Town of Poolesville, Poolesville – \$1000 for musical performances by the Washington Revels.
